

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES AND OTHER INFORMATION

Scholarships are awarded to students who have a variety of talents and interests. In fact, many great scholarships are designed for students who devote their time to such diverse fields as foreign language, arts, writing, oratory, and community service, just to name a few. Typically, these programs are entirely “grade blind” – meaning that grades are not used as a judging criteria. Some scholarship contests specify that applicants have a minimum 2.5 GPA. Once you have cleared this minimum bar, grades don’t impact your chances of winning. You can find many scholarships online. You should **never** pay to set up an account or to apply for scholarships on any website.

AMERICAN FIRE SPRINKLER ASSOCIATION ONLINE SCHOLARSHIP

Criteria: Open to high school seniors who are U.S. citizens and who will enroll at a college, university or trade school fall of 2019.
