


# Finishing Strong in 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter

With all the change we have experienced throughout this school year, we know that many of our students are concerned about their learning and grades. We want to make sure our students have the opportunity to recover the learning of key concepts so that they can move forward into 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter with the skills and confidence they need to be successful.

Below is a summary of how students can recover their possibly lost learning, raise their grade and start 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter strong for each of their classes.

<p><b><u>Mathematics Classes</u></b></p> <p>The Math department will offer a "Replacement Test" for the quarter. It will gather questions from previous tests and those tests will be available for practice before the test is taken. The test must be taken in person and will be available after Winter Break until January 14th. That score will replace the lowest or missing test score for the quarter. This policy does not apply to Concurrent Enrollment or AP classes. If you need further clarification, please approach your teacher.</p>	<p><b><u>English Language Arts Classes</u></b></p> <p>The ELA Department offers students a one-week grace for late work after the posted due date with NO PENALTY. After one week, a reduction in assignment value will be assessed (determined by the individual teacher) for each class period until the assignment value reaches 60 percent. Assignments will remain open in Canvas until the end of the unit; after that, students may work with teachers on a case by case basis to make up assignments and assessments for the quarter.</p>
<p><b><u>Social Studies Classes</u></b></p> <p><b>Assignments for each week need to be turned in before end of the school day on Friday.</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>We would like students to feel good about finishing the week, give them a "mental shutoff" for school and encourage timeliness.</li> </ul> <p><b>No late work is accepted after the Chapter or Unit Test.</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This means that you need to have the assignments in for the current chapter before the test is given.</li> <li>This also encourages students to stay current, which in turn helps them be more prepared for class.</li> </ul> <p>The Social Studies department is committed to helping our students. We know that emergencies arise and errors occur. We are willing to work with our students.</p>	<p><b><u>Art Classes</u></b></p> <p><b>Goal:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Students need to stay current on all assignments to prevent a late work point reduction.</li> <li>Students need to plan a time to get caught up on late work on their own time at home or with the teacher.</li> </ul> <p><b><u>Students can recover some of their possibly lost learning before the end of the quarter by:</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Scheduling a time with the teacher to come into the school to get caught up on current work and then late assignments.</li> </ul> <p>Students can turn in late work until 1 week before the quarter ends.</p>
<p><b><u>Science Classes</u></b></p> <p>All work is open until the end of the unit or quarter grade cutoff (as determined by teacher), whichever comes first. Students may request additional time to complete work beyond these deadlines. It will be up to teacher's discretion whether students will get extra time.</p>	<p><b><u>Performing Arts Classes</u></b></p> <p>Teachers have opened assignments on Canvas through the end of the quarter, and students are allowed to make up a specified amount of those, as communicated by each individual teacher.</p>
<p><b><u>CTE Classes</u></b></p> <p>Students can spend time with their teachers before or after school or during a predetermined time where both student and parent are informed. This specified time will be the responsibility of the student to work on projects and/or performance objectives to support their continued learning, with the understanding that the expectations of success is the responsibility of the student with support from the parent and educators. If the student has missing assignments or participation points to make up, they will work individually with the educator to identify a plan they can execute.</p>	<p><b><u>World Languages Classes</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Assignments will be open for a minimum of one week. Students can turn in assignments for up to two weeks after the due date. In some cases, students may need to ask the teacher to unlock the assignment.</li> <li>World Language is a proficiency-based course; therefore, routine practice is essential—and cramming at the end is discouraged. Please see the teacher for their individual late policy.</li> <li>Students can spend time with their teacher at a predetermined time before or after school or on Fridays to work on projects or study for the final assessment.</li> </ul>
<p><b><u>Physical Education/Health Classes</u></b></p> <p>Students can complete up to three make up work assignments each quarter, located on Canvas. Work with your teacher individually for further clarity.</p>	<p><b><u>Specialty Courses</u></b></p> <p>For teacher aide, advisory, intervention, Special Education and other specialty courses, please work with your individual teachers for information about learning opportunities at the end of this quarter.</p>

*\*Students with additional extenuating circumstances should work with their teachers individually to request considerations beyond these opportunities.*
