

Graduation Attire and Decorum

Graduates will arrive in their best dress, with gowns in hand. Gowns should have been pressed prior to the ceremony.

- In addition to the prescribed cap and gown, graduation attire may include traditional objects of religious, tribal, or cultural significance, that include but are not limited to:
 - Floral leis (no more than three); stole; sashes, or ceremonial flowers.
 - If a parent/legal guardian has a request regarding a personal item, the parent/legal guardian is asked to consult with the high school principal.
- Mantles, cords, insignias, or medals signifying achievement, honor, or recognition are restricted to awards issued and approved for display at graduation by Alta High School.
- No backpacks, bags, or purses will be allowed.
- No celebration items will be allowed. For example, no beach balls, silly string, air horns, balloons, confetti, animals, or other items that can be deemed disruptive.
- Graduates will show proper respect for those speaking, singing, or otherwise participating in the program as outlined. Showing respect includes giving attention to the ceremony and speakers, and not creating verbal, digital (cell phone) or other disruptions.
- The appropriate time for celebration is during the tassel ceremony.
- Graduates who do not follow this protocol or are otherwise uncooperative will be removed from the ceremony and receive their diploma at a later time.
