WHAT

- The ACT test will happen on Wednesday, March 12th.
- The ACT at Alta High School is free to juniors on this date.
- The ACT is used to measure skills in English, Math, Reading, and Science.
- Scores can be used to assist student's with college and career planning.

WHERE & WHEN

- All Juniors are already registered to take the ACT.
- Your test location will be posted the day before in the commons area according to last name.
- On March 20th you should arrive at your test room location between 7:15 and 7:30 am.
- You will not be allowed in the test room once test materials have been passed out and will miss your chance to take the free ACT.

WHERE AND WHEN

- Test instructions begin at 7:40 am! You must be checked in and be seated at this time!
- The test takes approximately 3 hours and 15 minutes.

WHAT TO BRING

- Original state issued or school Photo ID – Paper ID is not accepted.
- No. 2 pencils (NOT mechanical)
- Approved calculator
- District assigned Chromebook
 - Fully charged with updates

WHAT NOT TO BRING

- Anything else! ESPECIALLY:
 - Cell phone
 - Smart watch
 - AirPods
 - Food/drinks (snacks will be provided for the break)

- TestNav App Check
- Make sure your Chromebook is up to date!
- Sign up for a MyACT account so you can get scores sent directly to you.

TESTNAV APP CHECK

- Do not sign in to your Chromebook
- Click on Apps in the left hand corner
- Click on TestNav
- Click on the person symbol in the upper right hand corner
- Choose App Check
- Choose Run App Check
- Sign out of Chromebook

UPDATE CHROMEBOOK STEPS

- Sign in to your Chromebook
- Click on the time in the right hand corner
- Click on the “gear” icon
- Click on “About Chrome OS” – Bottom Left
- Click “Check for Update”
